### Pre-Chiropractic Curriculum

The courses listed below will meet the current prerequisite course requirements for admission into the Doctor of Chiropractic program, and students must have completed a minimum of 90 semester hours. All courses must be completed with a minimum grade of "C" or better. The entering grade point average is a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students with a GPA of 2.75-2.99 will be reviewed on an individual basis. Some states require a bachelor's degree prior to state licensure. Other course selections may be acceptable upon approval from Cleveland University-Kansas City.

### Science Requirements \*

**You must have a minimum of 24 semester hours in life and physical sciences courses. At least half of the science courses must have a laboratory component. It is highly recommended that 8 hours are from the Chemistry Department.**
