REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DOCTOR OF CHIROPRACTIC PROGRAM

3.0 cumulative GPA in college

90 semester hours of college courses in the following areas:

- ◇ 6 hours of English or Communications
- ◇ 3 hours of Psychology
- ◇ 12 hours of Humanities and/or Social Sciences courses
- ◇ 24 hours of Life and Physical Sciences courses to include:
 - ◇ Courses in Biology, Anatomy and Physiology
 - ◇ 8 hours of General and Organic Chemistry are recommended
- ◇ Recommended electives to fulfill the required 90 semester hours

WHERE DO YOU WANT TO PRACTICE?

Pre-chiropractic and pre-licensure requirements vary from state to state. Each individual is encouraged to research this information prior to enrolling at Cleveland Chiropractic College, and each student is responsible for obtaining the current state licensure requirements. States that require a baccalaureate degree prior to matriculation into a chiropractic program:

Texas does not require a baccalaureate degree at this time; however, they do have specific prerequisite requirements. Contact your advisor or the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners at 512-305-6700.

Florida—contact your advisor or the Florida Board of Chiropractic Medicine at 850-488-0595 for specific requirements. A bachelor's degree is required at this time.
