

**Doctor of Chiropractic Degree Program at Cleveland University-Kansas City
Licensure Disclosure Statement**

The Doctor of Chiropractic program (DCP) at Cleveland University-Kansas City is awarded programmatic accreditation by The Council on Chiropractic Education, 10105 E. Via Linda, Suite 103 - 3642, Scottsdale, AZ, 85258-4321, phone: (480)443-8877, Website: www.cce-usa.org.

The program is designed to meet educational requirements for licensure in Kansas, as well as other states and U.S. territories. Graduates of the program will be eligible to sit for the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE), national practical exam (Part IV). Per NBCE, "Boards in every U.S. jurisdiction accept or require NBCE examinations as part of their licensing criteria." In addition, state exams are required in Florida, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Oregon. The Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards (FCLB) provides information about state licensure, including links to board websites and regulatory language as well as list of those jurisdictions which include the requirement of an earned bachelor's degree.

The table indicates whether or not the DCP meets the educational requirements for licensure.
