1. On 4/15/2020, Cleveland University-Kansas City (CUKC) signed and returned to the Department of Education (ED) the Certification and Agreement to use no less than 50 percent of funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
2. The total allocation CUKC is scheduled to receive from ED is \$111,906, pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. These funds were received on 5/4/2020.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of this report is \$111,906.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 497.
5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 497.
6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

To receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant, students were required to have filed a FAFSA or been eligible to file a FAFSA. Students were enrolled in a degree program on March 13, 2020 (date national emergency declared) and were active on May 28, 2020 (distribution of funds date).

Following the Secretary's guidance to recognize student need; widely distribute the aid, and to get the aid into the student's hands as quickly as possible, the University elected to distribute approximately 3% of the funds in equal amounts to students receiving Pell grants based on their 2019-2020 FASFA.

The share of funds going to the group of Pell-receiving students is slightly more than the share of funds going to the group of non-Pell receiving students. The Pell-receiving students received \$275 per student.

The remaining Emergency Financial Aid Grants funds were distributed in equal amounts to the remaining non-Pell eligible students. This group of students received \$223.82 per student.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Distribution of Emergency Financial Aid Grants funds to Students was automatic (no application was required) and completed on May 28, 2020. Funds were transferred to student's bank accounts via ACH (or by other instructions of individual students).

Students were instructed that CARES Act-Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students are to be used to cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).
